## Dear Parents....

Recently we began holding an all-school assembly right before lunch each day. The bulk of this five-minute assembly time is designed for me to have a conversation with the students about the readings from Mass, the saint of the day, and/or about virtuous behavior.

Lately, I have talked about the importance of creating a Lenten plan and having both something good we give up and something better we are adding to our lives. E.g. giving up chocolate and adding reading from the Gospels each day for five minutes. I also told them how important it is to do our best to keep secret the good things that we do.

The past three days, the Gospel has addressed the Pharisees. Yesterday, I started by telling the students that I was the *most* humble. I said it as seriously as I could. In just under a second, even though I showed no sign that I was joking, the vast majority of them bust out laughing. They could easily see just how ridiculous my statement was.

The Pharisees looked good on the outside, but they really just wanted others to think well of them. Today, Jesus told the story of the rich man and Lazarus, and it says he told it to the Pharisees. Ultimately, the rich man was selfish. He only cared how he looked and not about caring for those in need around him. For us to be truly good, we need to be careful to hide, when we can, the good we do and instead of being selfish, be a person for others.

I encourage you to talk with your children each day about what they remember from the homily at Mass and from our daily assembly.

Peter, 5th grade Q: What have you enjoyed the most about going to school?


A: I really like science - learning about the natural world, energy, and things like that.
