Dear Parents....

Recently, I found the prayer from which comes the prayer we say after morning Mass. The original is actually four pages! It is significant that St. Thomas More wrote the prayer after being condemned to death.

The new piece of information that I learned is that More was condemned to die on Thursday, July 1, 1535 and was martyred on the morning of Tuesday, July 6. At most, he had only five days from sentencing to execution. He did not pray the prayer he wrote very long.

More wrote this prayer to prepare himself for death. It is safe to say that he wrote it with intense focus and passion.

Having been in prison for nearly fifteen months, awaiting his trial and sentencing, More knew his death was a very real possibility. Any shred of hope for kindness from his old friend, the king, evaporated after his sentencing. It is then that he wrote this prayer.

Hopefully, the context within which the prayer was composed will increase our love for it and the vigor with which we pray it. I encourage you to look up the entire prayer entitled, "A Devout Prayer." There is nothing quite like the knowledge of our death to clarify our vision--all the more so when it is the vision of a saint of the highest order.

A: He can tell if you're having a good day or a bad day or are really struggling with something and he'll come and just say, "Are you okay?" and he'll help you with anything you need.




Stefan, 5th grade
